## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Happy Holidays! The holiday lights are up, the trees are decorated and for sure the shopping has begun!! This time of year can be so busy – I hope you are able to take a moment to count your blessings. This community is blessed to have all of you helping and serving those in need – especially around the holidays.

The 2017-2018 year is in full swing and our Active members have already accomplished a number of important tasks. During our October meeting, Active members approved a new budget for the year as well as a plan for the distribution of over \$5,000 raised last year in support of furthering our mission and focus programs. I am so moved by the generosity of our members and community and am proud of the hard work our members put in to planning and executing on fundraising opportunities. Because of this, JLEC will be donating \$4,319 to the Diaper Bank, \$1,110 to Kids in the Kitchen and will be able to support our leadership development efforts by sending one member to the AJLI Annual Conference in April.

As the Kids in the Kitchen program transitions to Lily Pad Lab, our focus in the year ahead will be on improving the foundation of The Diaper Bank program through strengthening our partnership with Feed My People Food Bank, increasing community awareness of the program, updating marketing materials, and streamlining the process for individuals and businesses interested in hosting diaper drives. Our members have also elected to partner with two local nonprofits improving the lives of others in the community:

- **Fierce Freedom** - Started in 2012, Fierce Freedom works to educate and raise awareness about human trafficking in northwest Wisconsin. By educating the public, law enforcement, politicians and others about human trafficking, Fierce Freedom continues to help reduce this horrific crime. Fierce Freedom is the most recent recipient of the JLEC Endowment funds and many of you were very moved by their presentation at our spring banquet.
- **Children's Hospitals of Wisconsin Child Advocacy Center** - The Child Advocacy Center is a safe place for kids who may have been abused. The center brings together a team of specially trained professionals who evaluate and investigate cases of child abuse and help children and their families. We have completed multiple Done-in-a-Day projects for this organization over the past three years and they are also a past recipient of JLEC Endowment funds.

As you can see, our League year is off to a great start and I haven't even mentioned the fantastic women we are welcoming into Junior League this year. I want to extend a warm welcome to **Heather Murray, Jessica Rauckman, Holly Thomas, and Jen Wiltgen**. We look forward to getting to know you during the upcoming year and are thrilled you have chosen to join JLEC!

I am incredibly proud to serve as President of JLEC and look forward to the many social and civic opportunities that come with being a member of League – read on for information about a few really fun events on the horizon.
